Woodhill Rise – Improvement Works

As previously communicated, Norfolk County Council will soon start work resurfacing the footway on Woodhill Rise. These works will include a number of elements explained further below:

Woodhill Rise - Footway Resurfacing

The main focus of the works will see the resurfacing in of the footway in 100m sections on Woodhill Rise, this will take place during various phases over an 8-week period commencing on 24 June 2024. These works mean a full road closure for the duration will need to be implemented, this is to ensure the safety of the workers and the public.

During these works, a diversion will be in place on: Olive Road – Oval Road – Oval Ave. Please see **Diversion Route Plan** below.

Leewood Crescent - No Parking Notice

Throughout the 8-week duration of works, a no parking notice will be introduced on Leewood Crescent. This is to allow contractors' access to their compound and for their heavy plant vehicles.

Night Road Closure

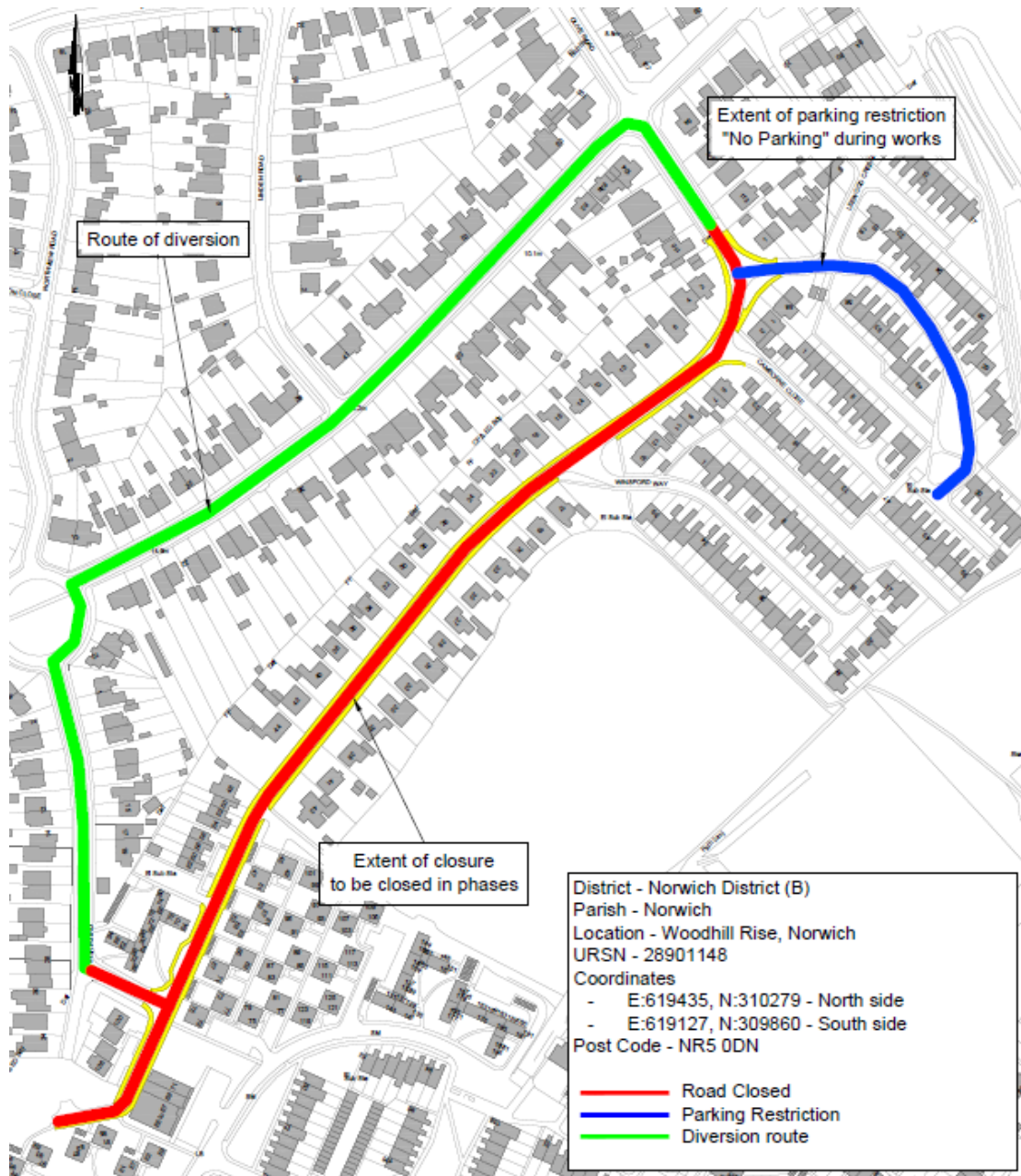
As part of the works taking place on Woodhill Rise, Norfolk County Council will resurface and regrade the surface on Leewood Crescent. A letter outlining the work has already been sent to residents. This will involve a 1-night road closure (11 hours – 7pm-6am) with access maintained under stop / go conditions. There is currently no fixed date for when this work will take place, however once the main works start on Woodhill Rise we should have a firm date, it could potentially take place within the first two weeks of the initial work starting.

We aim to minimise any inconvenience and will ensure the most disruptive work is completed early in the evening.

The County Council thanks people for their patience while this improvement work is completed.

The work which will cost £140,400 and will be carried out by Norfolk County Council's Infrastructure Department and their contractors.
